

Don't forget, we need a photo of your donation along with the entry form. If you need help with the photo you can bring it to a meeting and we will make sure a photo gets taken.



AUGUST BLOCK OF THE MONTH

ext month we will make scrappy half-square triangle blocks. Use a variety of light, medium and dark fabrics to add sparkle to your squares.

- 1. Cut 8 different color fabrics into 5-inch squares. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 4 of the squares (Diagram 1).
- 2. Place the right sides of the marked squares onto the right sides of the unmarked squares (Diagram 2).
- 3. Sew 1/4-inch away from the drawn line on both sides. Cut on the drawn line to make 2 half-square triangles. Press seams open and trim blocks to 4 1/2 inches (Diagram 3).
- 4. Lay out 4 different half-square triangle units in 2 rows of 2 units each. Sew the units together in each row. Join rows to make an 8 1/2-inch block using the 8 different fabrics. You should have two 8 1/2-inch blocks.
- 5. Make 2 to 20 blocks. Bring your completed, unquilted blocks to the August meeting. Put your name in the container for each block you bring.
