Deanne established Snuggles Quilts Pattern Company in 2005. It is a quilt pattern design company. All the patterns are original designs of **Deanne Eisenman**. The company grew out of Deanne's desire to share

her easy and fun pattern ideas with the quilting world!

**Deanne's patterns have appeared in many quilt magazines including, Quiltmaker, McCalls, Primitive Quilts & Projects and Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting. She has also had patterns appear in the American Patchwork & Quilting calendars several times. Deanne is a published author of two books from Martingale & Company. *Country-Fresh Quilts* was published in 2008 and *Scrap Quilts Go Country* was published in 2011. Her current book, published at the end of 2014, is called *Blooming Patchwork*.**



The namesake of the company, Snuggles, was the family cat for many years. Snuggles liked to lay on quilt tops while Deanne tried to quilt them and she liked to burrow into the basket of scrap batting to nap. She thought she was the owner/designer. So, when Deanne was looking to name her company, Snuggles Quilts seemed to be the logical choice. Our lovely Snuggles left us in 2015 at the ripe old age of 17.

If you have any questions, do not hesitate to ask Nancy Post or Carol Logue. Check your guild yearbook for our contact information.




## BLOCK OF THE MONTH

COORDINATED BY CHERYL GUACCI AND PATTY THOMPSON 2018

Thanks to everyone that turned in “The Greek Cross” blocks last month. We gave away three bundles of colorful “Greek Crosses” surrounded by polka-dots of all sizes. Bundles of at least 12 blocks were won by Dana Cox, Phyllis Derigo and Peggy Schneider.

“Double Square” is to be turned in at the May meeting. It is to be done in all florals. This is an 8” square finished block using a floral with a dark background and a floral with a light background. You still have time to make up to five blocks. They are easy and if you win, it will make a great scrappy quilt! See the website for complete construction details.

The block for June is called “Bright Star”. This block celebrated June 14, Flag Day. It will make a beautiful patriot quilt just in time for the Fourth of July. Use a white background and any red or blue print/solid for the star. Use a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ ” seam. Use a good quality 100% cotton. This is an  $9\frac{1}{2}$ ” square unfinished.



For each block cut: From the white background, cut four  $3\frac{1}{2}$ ” squares and two  $3\frac{7}{8}$ ” squares cut on the diagonal to equal four triangles. From the blue or red, cut one  $3\frac{1}{2}$ ” square and two  $3\frac{7}{8}$ ” squares cut on the diagonal to equal four triangles.

Sew one blue or red triangle to each of the white triangles. Press the seam towards the blue or red. Arrange the individual units according to the diagram. Assemble three rows pressing the seams for row 1 and 3 to the left; row 2 to the right. Sew row 1 to 2 and 2 to 3. Give a final press. Your completed block must measure  $9\frac{1}{2}$ ” square unfinished.

Complete up to five blocks. Return the completed block(s) for this month to the Block-of-the-Month table at the meeting and, for each block you make, your name is put into a drawing. Before the end of the meeting, one or more names will be drawn and the winner(s) win the blocks to take home and use as you like.

## Quilts for the Show

Please consider entering your quilt in our “Stiches in Bloom” quilt show. Our show is NOT a juried or judged show; it is a display of wonderful quilts.

### Entry Form

You will need to complete an entry form for each quilt you would like displayed. The entry form should be turned in as soon as possible, but **no later than** the general meeting on **June 9**, to **Lois Masukawa or Maria Zirbes**. The entry form must include a color photo of the quilt; however, the quilt does not need to be completed in the photo. (A standard 4” x 6” photo works best.) The form should be filled out completely. It is especially important to answer the question: *What is something you would like the viewer to know about this item?* Each quilt made has its own story. Tell a short version of your quilt’s story. Some examples are

I made this for my son’s graduation.

This was made from my granddaughter’s dresses.


It took me 7 years to complete this quilt.

Measure accurately. The width is measured from side to side, the length is measured from top to bottom, as you would like it to be hung. **Note: quilts larger than 90” will be folded.** We will display as many quilts as possible; however, if you enter more than one quilt, please indicate on the form which you would prefer to be hung first, second, etc., if all cannot be displayed.

Entry forms will be available in this newsletter, on our website and at the April and May guild meetings.

### Submit Quilt

Quilts are to be turned in at the June or July meeting. (Yes, there is a July meeting for quilt show business only.) You will receive a receipt for your quilt which you will need to retrieve your quilt from the pick-up location after the quilt show closes. Items will not be returned without receipts.




