Quilters' UFO Challenge 2020

"Come Join our UFO Parade in 2020!"

This is a chance to turn five UFOs into quilts in only one year!

✦ Describe the finished quilts on the next page. Make sure that No. 1 is the one you want to work on first. Give enough information to easily identify each quilt. For example, "green

churn dash" is a better description than "Bill's birthday quilt." Fill out the list and make a copy for yourself so you know what to work on next!

"Finished" means quilted, bound and labeled.

✦ The first quilt, due on January 8, 2020 will be No. 1 on your list. It may be turned in early. After that, one quilt will be due every two months, except the fourth quilt will have 3 months because we have no meeting in July. The order of the quilts will be chosen randomly from the remaining numbers. That means that the second quilt due will **not** necessarily be #2 on your list.

✦ When you turn in your first UFO for inspection, you will be given a ribbon and a button to attach showing that quilt is finished. You will receive another button for each UFO as it is recorded as finished. There will be drawings for prizes after each due date is reached; therefore, all who finish even just one quilt will be eligible to win a prize that month. Other prizes will be awarded when the year is up.

Due Dates: January 8 March 11 May 13 August 12 October 14

We have 37 members signed up for our 2020 UFO Challenge and 28 quilts completed!!

It's not too late to join the parade! You'll find the entry form in the newsletter so fill out your paper work and bring in the entry fee of \$10.00 at our February 12 guild meeting.

YOUR #2 QUILT ON YOUR LIST IS DUE MARCH 11.

2020 QUILT SHOW

Next year's quilt show, "Sew Forward in the 20s", will be July 18 & 19 at the United Food & Commercial Workers Union Hall, 8530 Stanton Ave, Buena Park. We have a much bigger display space than in previous years so be thinking about what quilt(s) you want to enter.

During the November guild meeting Quilt Show challenge quilt entries began. If you haven't done so already, stop by the table up front, pay your \$5 entry fee and pick up your bag containing entry instructions and the two crayons that are your challenge colors.

Show subcommittee Chairpersons are filling in nicely. Ann Leibovitz has agreed to take the lead with quilt layout and Mary Lou Ripper has agreed to help with Quilt take down. We still need someone to step up and take the lead on hanging quilts. The layout will indicate where all the quilts go and the take in group will have them organized to match the layout. So... hanging really means hanging up the quilts and the chair is responsible for organizing and overseeing this activity. Can you help with this? Please contact Martha Sterbens or Mary Burger.

Each of the chairs will be putting together a committee of volunteers to accomplish the task they have agreed to lead so there's lots of places for you to volunteer. The first request is for a couple of people willing and able to help with acquisition (handing out and collecting entry forms.) If you're interested please contact Julie Carman, Martha Sterbens or Mary Burger.

QUILT SHOW BOUTIQUE

Starting at the Guild Meeting in February we will start collecting Boutique items for the Quilt Show. There will be an area set up in the back of the room next to Susan G. Komen (Barbara Purks). We will be accepting your home-made items every month through June.

If you haven't already started making something, now is the time to start. The venue is at a new location and is so much larger and brighter. We need your participation to make this Boutique as successful as in the past.

Items do not have to be quilt related but they do have to be handmade. Traditional items have been things like pin cushions, aprons, table runners, jewelry, crochet and knitted items, bags, baby bibs, just to name a few. But you don't have to limit yourself to these items. It is not necessary to make several of any one item, anywhere from 1 to 6 is a good number and seems reasonable to accomplish. Anything you feel inspired to make and donate will be appreciated.

Our members have shown over and over again how talented they are and everyone looks forward to seeing the wonderful surprises they can find at the Boutique.

The Orange Grove Quilting Guild 2020 “Round Robin”

...a group project where members add a round or border to a central block, creating a medallion quilt.

Coordinated by Cheryl Guacci (562-708-1167) & Patty Thompson (562-857-1533)

Guidelines: When you sign up, you are committing to...

Meeting the deadlines and finishing the project.

Working on another member's quilt as you would want them to work on yours: Using GOOD QUALITY fabrics; accurate measurements; straight cutting and ¼" seams. Doing the best work you can do.

Following the vision of the owner of the center block.

Not sharing what you are doing with any other guild member so that the final quilt top will be a surprise for the participants. This is a “blind” round robin.

Google “Round Robin Quilts” online or, search on Pinterest for many ideas and inspiration.

Upon completion of the RR, the owner is free to alter, add, adjust or do anything they want with the quilt.

Drop-outs must notify Cheryl or Patty. Please note that if you drop out, you face the possibility of forfeiting the return of your completed quilt top to the person who picked up your responsibilities.

Instructions:

On or Before the February 12, 2020 Guild Meeting:

Sign up at the “Round Robin” table by completing the Registration form and paying the \$10 participation fee.

March 11, 2020, Guild Meeting:

Pick up your Round Robin Bag from the RR table. Your bag will include: a SMALL JOURNAL; a LABEL for your quilt and a FABRIC PEN for writing on the label.

Before April 8, 2020, Guild Meeting:

Make your center block. The center should be between a 12” – 16” square. If you wish to use a rectangle the longest side should be no more than 16” and the shortest side no less than 12”. Your center block may be printed, pieced, painted, appliqued, etc.

(Optional) Select fabrics to be used in the rounds.

(Optional) Pre-wash all fabrics to be used in the quilt. This is particularly recommended if you are using reds or very dark saturated colors.

Complete the first page of the SMALL JOURNAL and the LABEL with your name, etc.

April 8, 2020, Guild Meeting THE ROUND ROBIN BEGINS...

1. Turn in your bag at the BEGINNING OF THE GUILD MEETING to the Round Robin table. Your bag must include:

the center block and (optional) coordinating fabrics for the rounds

the small journal

the label and fabric pen

2. At the END OF THE GUILD MEETING pick up your new assignment.

For the next several months... you will be ADDING A ROUND OR BORDER: 1. Each round must be 3 - 6 inches wide when finished. It can be plain, pieced, embroidered, appliqued, etc. It does not need to be symmetrical in shape, color, or style. 2. Add a round to at least two sides of the work you receive. 3. A block may be *turned-on-point*, if appropriate; if so, your round would be the adding of triangles to each side to make the block a square again.

4. *Instead of adding a new round*, you may embellish a previously added round with appliqué.

When done with your round, SQUARE IT UP!!!

SIGN AND DATE THE ROUND THAT YOU DID ON THE QUILT LABEL.

Place your finished work in its bag along with the fabric pen, journal, label and even a few scraps from yardage you used from your stash.

RETURN it to the guild meeting to exchange it for another bag and do the next round!!

RETURN DATES:

1st Round is due MAY 13. 2nd Round is due JUNE 10. 3rd Round is due AUGUST 12. 4th Round is due SEPTEMBER 9. 5th Round is due OCTOBER 14.
