String Piecing Bootcamp – Natalie Barnes June 11, 2020

Natalie Barnes will be our featured speaker and teacher for June, 2020. Many of us know Natalie as a great teacher and pattern designer for her company, Beyond The Reef. It's a real treat to have her here with us.

Natalie says: "This is a concept class, or a theory class. The focus in this class will be on string piecing. We'll work with free form and foundation piecing. Then we'll take a look at what can be done with these string piecing elements. How about some appliqué? Triangles? Block arrangements? Half square triangle strips. Last but not least, we'll be talking about color and contrast and the use of both of these while working with string piecing. This is a working techniques class – we are not making a quilt, we are honing our techniques."

FEBRUARY PHILANTHROPY REPORT

Sew Day was a great success this month. Special thanks to Mary Burger for demonstrating glue basting, machine quilting, and machine binding. Our next Sew Day will be Thursday, March 5, at Driftwood Mobile Home Park. The address is 15321 Beach Blvd., Westminster. Doors open at 9:00 AM and we are generally ready to go by 9:30 AM. We break for lunch about noon. You can arrive any time and of course leave whenever you need to. You can cut fabric for pillow cases or quilt binding. You can select fabric for a quilt top. Or you can bring your sewing machine and work on a philanthropy project. If you just need batting for a philanthropy quilt, bring your top and we will cut a piece of batting for you. Also I will bring glue for basting. Hope to see you at Sew Day.

This month 41 quilts were turned in. Twenty-five were sent to St. Joseph for chemo patients. The other 16 are in storage waiting for the Marine Beach Party. Sixty-six pillowcases were turned in. Maybe you made something and find that you don't need it anymore. As suggested it is not necessary to make more than 1 to 6 items.

Traditional items have been bags, pin cushions, microwave bowls, aprons, table runners, mug rugs, wall hangings, jewelry, crochet and knitted items, just to name a few. Of course, anything that may inspire you is welcome. The only criteria is that is homemade.

Quilt Show Entry Information

Calling all quilts and items for entering our “Sew Forward into the 20’s” Quilt Show. Our show is **NOT** a juried or judged show. It’s a display of wonderful quilts, bags and other items such as pillows, table runners, quilted vests/jackets, etc. sewn by our members. Please consider entering. Remember, this show is for ALL levels of quilters. Here’s how it works:

Entry Form

You will need to complete an entry form for each quilt or item you would like displayed. The entry form should be turned in as soon as possible, but no later than the general meeting on June 10 to Julie Carman (jkarman@gmail.com or 714-964-1901). The entry form must include a color photo of the quilt/item, however, these items do not have to be completed in the photo. A standard 4” x 6” photo works best. The form should be filled out completely. **Please print clearly.** It is especially important to answer the question, “What is something you would like the viewer to know about this item?” Each item made has its own story. Tell a short version of your story. Some examples are:

I made this for my child’s graduation.

This was made from my granddaughter’s dresses.

It took me 7 years to complete this quilt.

Measure your quilt accurately. The width is measured side to side and length is measure top to bottom, as you would like it to be hung. Note: quilts larger than 90” may be folded. We will display as many quilts as possible. If you enter more than one quilt, please indicate on the form which you would prefer to hung first, second, third, etc., if all cannot be displayed.

Entry forms are available in the March, April, and May monthly newsletters, on our website, and at the March, April and May guild meetings.

Submit Your Item

Quilts/bags/other items are to be turned in at the June or July meeting. There will be a special July 8 guild meeting for quilt show business only at the Elk’s Lodge in Garden Grove.

Please submit your items enclosed in a pillowcase, labeled with your name and phone number. One item per pillowcase. You will receive a receipt for each item which you will need in order to pick-up each item after the quilt show closes.

Item Pick-Up

All items are to be picked up after the quilt show closes on Sunday, July 19 at the **UFCW Union Hall** in Buena Park. Please remember to bring your receipt. Items will not be returned without your receipt.

Items must be **delivered to the June or July guild meeting** and given to Acquisition Chair: Julie Carman (jkcarman@gmail.com) You will receive a receipt for the item turned in. **Items must be picked up after the show close, Sunday, July 19, at the quilt show location.** Only those on the take down committee are permitted to remove quilts from the display. Items will not be returned without receipts.

Every effort will be made to display items with loving care. Please check your homeowner's insurance policy to be sure your item is covered for unforeseen problems.

The undersigned maker/owner understands the above conditions and agrees to release OGQG from any liability from any claim for damage or loss resulting from loan of any quilt show item.

The Orange Grove Quilting Guild 2020 "Round Robin"

...a group project where members add a round or border to a central block, creating a medallion quilt.

Coordinated by Cheryl Guacci (562-708-1167) & Patty Thompson (562-857-1533)

Guidelines: When you sign up, you are committing to...

Meeting the deadlines and finishing the project.

Working on another member's quilt as you would want them to work on yours: Using GOOD QUALITY fabrics; accurate measurements; straight cutting and 1/4" seams. Doing the best work you can do.

Following the vision of the owner of the center block.

Not sharing what you are doing with any other guild member so that the final quilt top will be a surprise for the participants. This is a "blind" round robin.

Google "Round Robin Quilts" online or, search on Pinterest for many ideas and inspiration.

Upon completion of the RR, the owner is free to alter, add, adjust or do anything they want with the quilt.

Drop-outs must notify Cheryl or Patty. Please note that if you drop out, you face the possibility of forfeiting the return of your completed quilt top to the person who picked up your responsibilities.

Instructions:

On or Before the February 12, 2020 Guild Meeting:

Sign up at the "Round Robin" table by completing the Registration form and paying the \$10 participation fee.

March 11, 2020, Guild Meeting:

Pick up your Round Robin Bag from the RR table. Your bag will include: a SMALL JOURNAL; a LABEL for your quilt and a FABRIC PEN for writing on the label.

Before April 8, 2020, Guild Meeting:

Make your center block. The center should be between a 12" – 16" square. If you wish to use a rectangle the longest side should be no more than 16" and the shortest side no less than 12". Your center block may be printed, pieced, painted, appliqued, etc.

(Optional) Select fabrics to be used in the rounds.

(Optional) Pre-wash all fabrics to be used in the quilt. This is particularly recommended if you are using reds or very dark saturated colors.

Complete the first page of the SMALL JOURNAL and the LABEL with your name, etc.

April 8, 2020, Guild Meeting THE ROUND ROBIN BEGINS...

1. Turn in your bag at the BEGINNING OF THE GUILD MEETING to the Round Robin table. Your bag must include:

the center block and (optional) coordinating fabrics for the rounds

the small journal

the label and fabric pen

2. At the END OF THE GUILD MEETING pick up your new assignment.

For the next several months... you will be ADDING A ROUND OR BORDER: 1. Each round must be 3 - 6 inches wide when finished. It can be plain, pieced, embroidered, appliquéd, etc. It does not need to be symmetrical in shape, color, or style. 2. Add a round to at least two sides of the work you receive. 3. A block may be *turned-on-point*, if appropriate; if so, your round would be the adding of triangles to each side to make the block a square again.

4. *Instead of adding a new round*, you may embellish a previously added round with appliquéd.

When done with your round, SQUARE IT UP!!!

SIGN AND DATE THE ROUND THAT YOU DID ON THE QUILT LABEL.

Place your finished work in its bag along with the fabric pen, journal, label and even a few scraps from yardage you used from your stash.

RETURN it to the guild meeting to exchange it for another bag and do the next round!!

RETURN DATES:

1st Round is due MAY 13. 2nd Round is due JUNE 10. 3rd Round is due AUGUST 12. 4th Round is due SEPTEMBER 9. 5th Round is due OCTOBER 14.

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
