Glenda McNeil has 30 women working for her making masks for hospitals, and CHOC as needed. To date she has do-





Keeping in Contact During This Time of Covid-19

In this time of "Social Distancing" and no guild meetings the guild is working on keeping everyone informed.

We are now sending out our newsletters and other guild emails from a company called "Constant Contact." They have been very helpful in getting our newsletters and information out there.

Previously, we, Kathy Harvey and sometimes, me, were using our personal email addresses and using what's called "blind copy," sending the newsletters out in batches of about 20 or so, to our members, not hard, mostly time consuming. When my web designer daughter explained to me that we were jeopardizing our personal email addresses by doing this, i.e., we would be branded as "spammers" and be unable to use our own email addresses for our own use, and therefore, she suggested using "Constant Contact." As it turns out the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds has started using them as well.

Be assured that even though we can send as many emails per month as we want, we will not be "spamming" you with a lot of emails.

We are, however, going to send more than just the newsletters. In the coming days we will be having a "Mystery Quilt" put together for our guild by Lyn Mann. It should be fun. We will also have this information on our Facebook page. 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Headbands to Save our Ears!

It is a very different time in our world right now with the spread of the COVID-19 virus. I have received a few messages about people using this headband pattern to create a special headband with buttons for face masks to be attached to.

Thank you to Stephanie from Steph Jacobson Designs for being the first to share with me the one she had made and making me aware of this type of project.

I had a bunch of headbands in my stash and added some buttons (and whipped up a face mask with the ear elastic for a visual) so if you are interested in doing this you can have an idea of where to place the buttons.

Also, I suggest attaching buttons with embroidery thread for extra strength. Some people also prefer to use their sewing machine to add the buttons. I have always struggled with that, so I prefer to sew on buttons by hand lol. Something to consider though. But no matter what type of thread you use, make sure to sew it on really well so it will last for the workers. The buttons I have used are typically around 1", a little smaller or a little bigger, from my stash. That seems to be a good size.

Knitted "Ear Saver"



Size of needles is not really important. I used 5s. But, I would think any size from 5 to 8 would be fine.

Cast on 20 stitches of worsted weight yarn (Or however many you need to measure about 4 inches in length).

Knit every row until piece measures approximately 1 ¹/₂ inches wide.

Cast off and weave in ends.

Sew buttons on, any size from $\frac{34''}{4}$ to 1 $\frac{14''}{4}$, on each side for elastic to attach.


