On Feb 10 at 10am, Pam will give us a virtual Trunk Show of her work. The link for the Webinar will be posted on our Facebook page, as well as an email to all Guild members.





Pam will give us a head start for our summer decorating with this beautiful wall quilt. With her raw edge applique technique, we'll surely enjoy the process to complete this project. We'll also learn to use a facing instead of a binding on our quilt. If you haven't joined in on our virtual workshops, this is the time, give it a try!

There will be a pre-workshop Zoom meeting on Fri, Feb 5 at 9am, for about a half-hour.

Pam will teach the Red, White And Bloom workshop in two sessions. The first half will be on Thursday, Feb 11. We'll meet for two hours, from 9am-11am.

For the second half of the workshop, we'll meet one week later, Thursday, Feb 18. That will also be from 9am-11am. With that week in between, we should all be able to finish our quilt tops. Yay!

There is a \$10 required pattern for the workshop. You'll include that in your payment for the workshop and I'll deliver your pattern to you. Attendees will receive an email from me with the workshop link.

# <u>Susan K Cleveland – Disappearing Dresdens</u> <u>March 10 & 11, 2021</u> <u>PiecesBeWithYou.com</u>

Join in on our March 10 Webinar to meet one of the world's most enthusiastic personalities for ooo's, aaaah's, and laughter to learn a plethora of tips to increase accuracy and add fresh, interesting details with piping, prairie points, heavy threads, and embellishments, and add charming surprises to simple pieces. Susan will share real live quilts with close ups through the projector so you'll see oodles of detail.

March 10 at 10am. The link for the Webinar will be posted on our Facebook page, as well as an email to all Guild members. Don't miss out on this good time!



Double points put a contemporary spin on this long-time favorite and they eliminate the need for the traditional appliqued circle in the center of each circle! Using quarter-circle, half-circle, and three-quartercircle units adds another interesting bit. Learn Susan's tips for speedily turning the wedge points with the Prairie Pointer Tool and use tricky piecing to assemble the arcs, circle and background. Points are three-dimensional and design possibilities are endless. Finished quilt is 27"x 24".

This is a workshop I'm really looking forward to. Hope to see you there!

There is a \$9 pattern required for the workshop. The pattern, and any other optional items for the class, must be purchased online at <u>www.PiecesBeWithYou.com</u> by Feb 20. There will be a special code for our workshop members to avoid a delivery fee. I will receive your items and deliver them to you.

"Cre-a-tiv-i-ty", which builds on her previous visit with us, will be Jean's topic. The Webinar will be Apr 14 at 10am and the link will be posted on our Facebook page, as well as an email to all Guild members.



"Pineapples have always been a symbol of Hospitality. Create a warm and inviting welcome to your home with a Pineapple Quilt by using my easy and fast organized techniques. There is no messy paper to tear-away! By using a pineapple ruler, or even a square Omni Grid ruler you will be successful in making this quilt.

This quilt can be made as large or small as you like, complicated or simple, anyway you like. Similar to a log cabin block, it starts with a central square and then grows larger by sewing strips of fabric out from the middle.

Don't want to make a whole quilt? Why not make a 20" square pillow?"

Jean will teach the Pineapple Express workshop in two sessions. The first half will be on Thursday, Apr 15. We'll meet for three hours, from 9am-12pm. For the second half of the workshop, we'll meet one week later, Thursday, Apr 22. That will also be from 9am-12pm. With a week between classes, we should make good headway on our quilt tops.

# PHILANTHROPY

Even though 2020 was a difficult year, with your help Philanthropy was able to continue distributing quilts and pillowcases. We were able to donate 334 quilts and 300 pillowcases. Hopefully, we are able to even do better in 2021.

We will start the Drive through again starting Wednesday, February 3,

and every 1st Wednesday of the month, from 10-12 at the Elks Lodge. So, put it on your calendar, the 1st Wednesday of every month. Look for us at the front entrance of the Elks Lodge, 11551 Trask Ave. Garden Grove (corner of Trask and Newhope) from 10-12. This is a perfect opportunity to pick up and drop off anything for philanthropy.

There is always a need for quilters. Quilts that need quilting are usually lap size or smaller. For those that want to practice and experiment with quilting this is the place to do that. Just simple quilting is all that is needed. Thanks for any help to get these quilt tops completed.

There are also quilts that need binding, pillowcase kits, Trip Around the World blocks that need to be put together.

Due to the virus, storage limits, no Ways and Means or Fabric and Trims and the fact we have not been able to meet for sew day, please limit your donations of fabric to a minimum of 1 yard cuts. We always need children friendly 1 yard cuts of fabric for pillowcase kits.

We are still collecting the Hobbs barcode number in order to get a discount when purchasing the batting for philanthropy. These can also be dropped off at the Drive through.

Thanks to everyone for continuing to support philanthropy with your generosity and talent. We wouldn't be able to continue to donate without your help.


