




Round Robin Ladies:

I want to also thank the volunteers that participated in the affair, Dolores Gilbert, Ginger Titterington, Janine D'Anna and Phillis Barge. This could not have been done without all the help. THANK YOU! Because we have not been able to meet for Sew Day our fabric is not being used as quickly as before. We will try and put out some excess fabric at every Drive Through. This fabric will be set out on a table for FREE. Donations will be accepted but not necessary, a container will be out for your convenience. Any donations will be used to offset the cost of batting. Also, we are trying to get our Sew Day started again but it looks like that won't be until January. It seems like a long time but really it is just around the corner. 
